We know that after you read those opening lyrics to the "Happy Days" theme song, you're never getting them out of your head. But that's a good thing -- because with this "Where Are They Now?" slideshow, we're talking about Milwaukee's best here. The Cunninghams. Potsie and Ralph. And the Fonz ... The coolest guy in town, a total chick magnet, and able to turn anything on with only the light touch of his fist.

"Happy Days" premiered in 1974 and was actually a spin-off of the comedy anthology series "Love American Style." It hit the airwaves during a dour time in America when Vietnam and Watergate were in the headlines and TV viewers were looking for an escape -- and an idealized 1950s household seemed like the perfect setting. On the heels of the box office success of '50s-themed "American Graffiti," "Happy Days" was an immediate hit after it premiered on ABC -- and shortly thereafter, its characters joined the lexicon of the TV beloved.

It also spawned future Hollywood mogul Ron Howard and no less than three spin-offs: "Laverne & Shirley," "Mork & Mindy," and "Joanie Loves Chachi." When it left the airwaves in 1984, in a finale seen by millions, it left a gap in the TV landscape ... but plenty of endearing memories remain.

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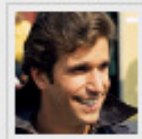


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#### Ron Howard: Then

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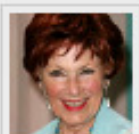
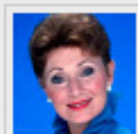


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#### Ron Howard: Now

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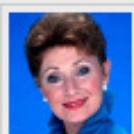
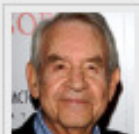


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#### Henry Winkler: Then

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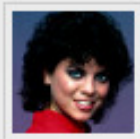


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#### Henry Winkler: Now

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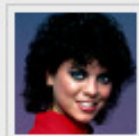


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#### Tom Bosley: Then

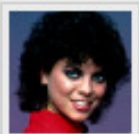

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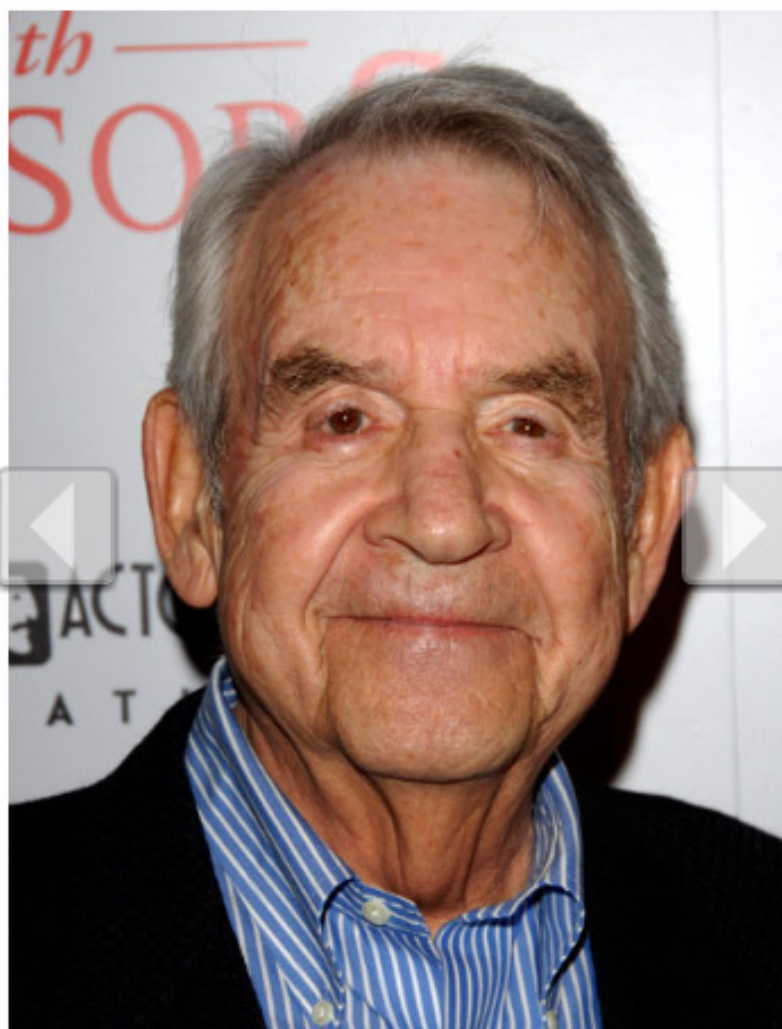
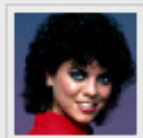
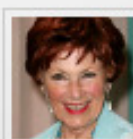


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#### Marion Ross: Then

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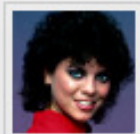
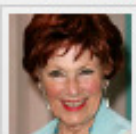


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#### Marion Ross: Now

Ross continued to work on shows like "Touched by an Angel" and "The Drew Carey Show" and even made appearances on "Gilmore Girls" and "Brothers and Sisters." But to us she'll always be "Mrs. C."



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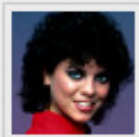


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#### Erin Moran: Then

Meddling and precocious, Joanie grew up before our eyes. At first spurning Chachi's advances, she eventually succumbed to his charms and ended up marrying him.

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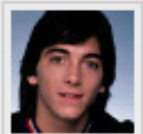


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#### Erin Moran: Now

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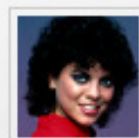


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#### Anson Williams: Then

A best friend to Ritchie & Ralph, Potsie shared his buddies' ineptitude with the ladies – though he WAS a good singer, often performing at Arnold's. Too bad the '50s didn't have "American Idol."



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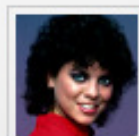


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#### Anson Williams: Now

Like Ron Howard, Williams became a director after "Days," helming episodes of "Beverly Hills 90210," "Melrose Place," "Star Trek: Voyager," "Xena," and "Charmed."



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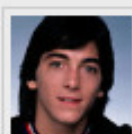


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#### Donny Most: Then

Yelping "I still got it" after bad jokes, lovable buffoon Ralph Malph was a loyal friend to Ritchie and left the show with him (in 1980) to join the Army – but returned for the series finale.

During "Days," Most appeared in other '70s shows like "The Love Boat." He recently voiced himself on "Family Guy," and satirical paper the Onion has appointed him "Secretary of Retro."



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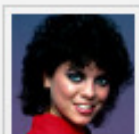


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#### Scott Baio: Then

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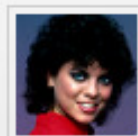


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#### Scott Baio: Now

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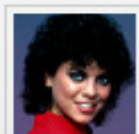


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#### Al Molinaro: Then and Now

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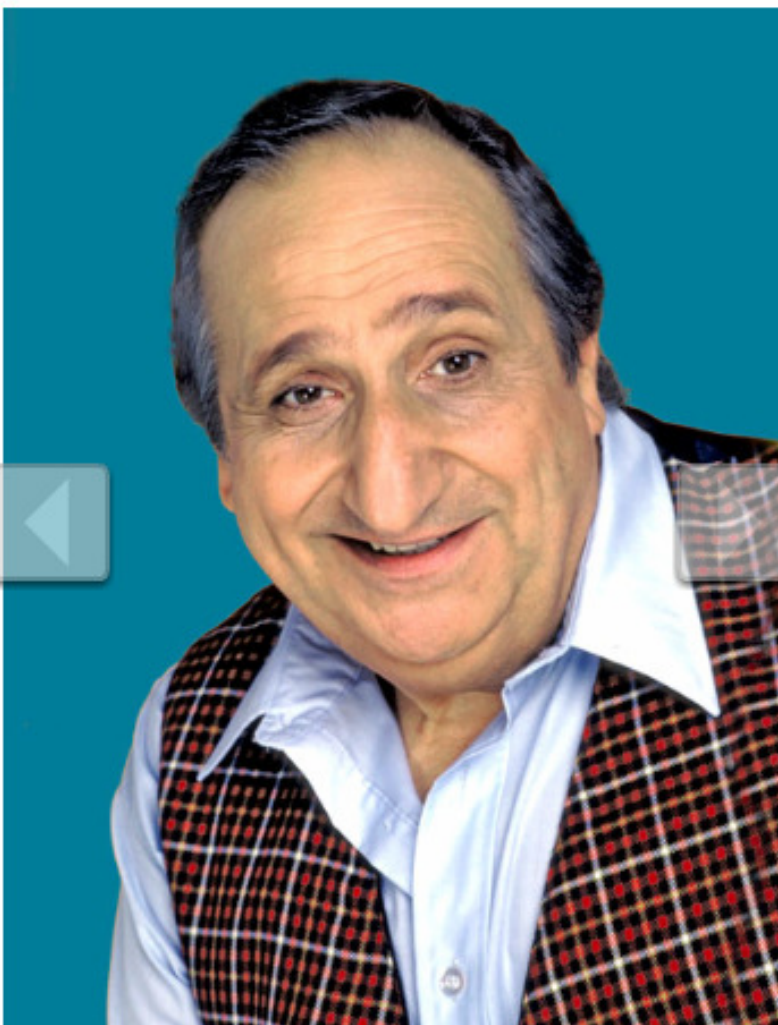
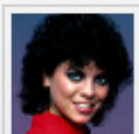


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
